

# Umberto Cesari

## Colle del Re Albana di Romagna DOCG

Albana di Romagna became Italy's first DOCG white wine in 1987. Umberto Cesari was amongst the only few that met the high standards to be labeled DOCG. Named for the blonde-haired Princess Albana, the daughter of a Roman Emperor.

### Varietal(s):

100% Albana

### Vineyards:

Harvested from the estate-owned, single-vineyard "Colle del Re," or the "King's Hills," planted exclusively to the Albana varietal in north-central Italy's Emilia-Romagna.

### Winemaking:

Hand-harvested, then soft-pressed upon reception at the cellar. Vinified entirely in stainless steel tanks at a controlled temperature of 16°C. The wine rested for 3 months prior to bottling.

### Tasting Notes:

A delicate bouquet of apricots dominates. Although Albana can be sweet or dry, still or frizzante, this particular version is a well-balanced, still, dry rendition with a crisp, clean finish. Pair with the region's traditional stuffed pastas, like cheese tortellini or agnolotti. Also excellent with seafood and poultry.



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
